HUME believes that decisions and knowledge are driven by experiences, feelings and emotions rather than rational thinking. That's why human nature and behaviour is influenced by passion more than reasons because reason is governed by our feelings based on his ideology. Opposing the ideas of the philosophical rationalists his ideas are known to focused on the area of "Empiricism & Skepticism."
